Prize money can be collected after 4.45pm

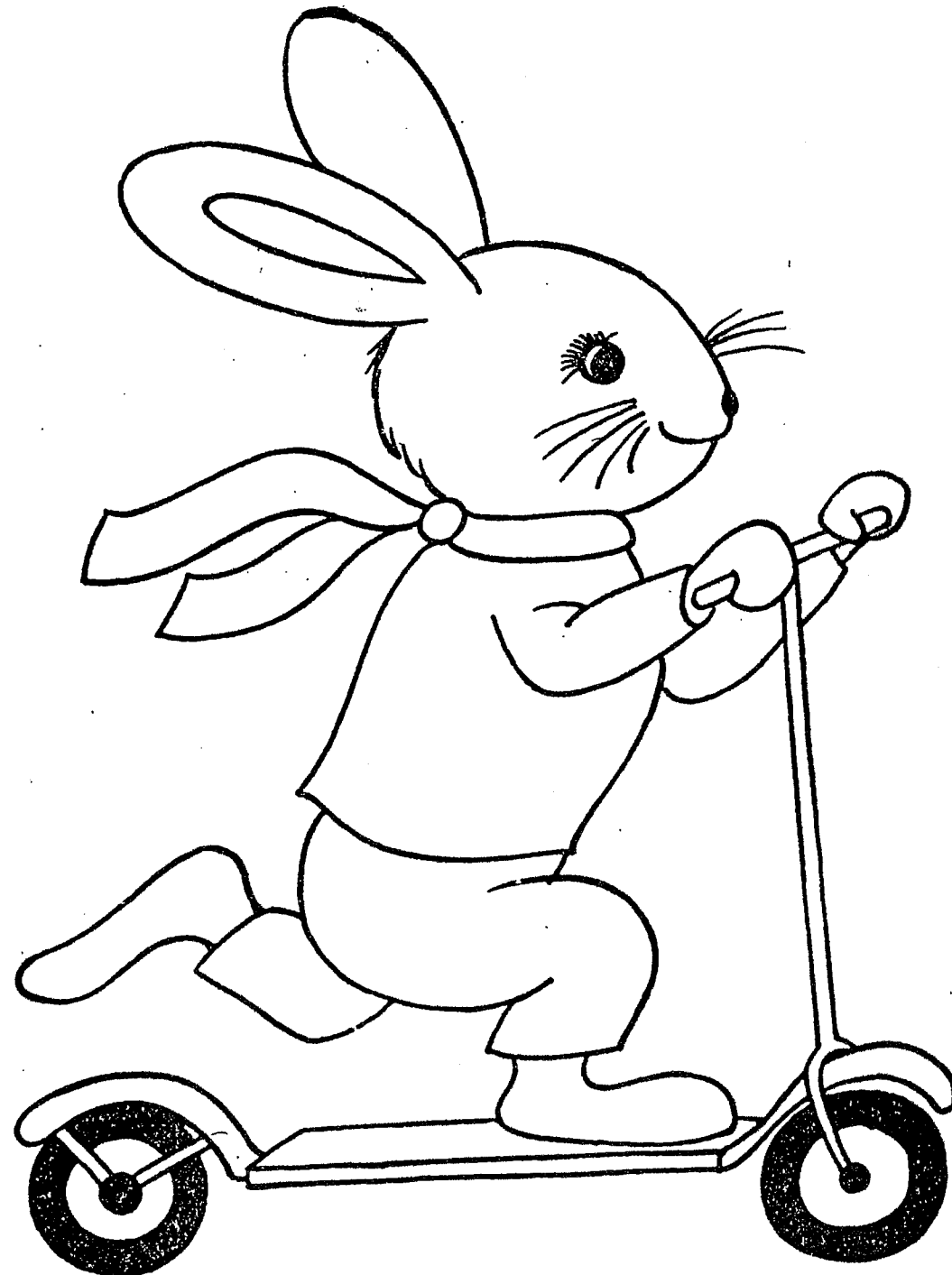
Farm and Field trophies will be presented at the Annual Lunch which is to be held on November 20th .

Return - Any outstanding cups must be returned by 1st July unless alternative arrangements have been made with the Cup Steward



- OBJECTIVES -

- 1 To watch over, protect and further the interests of all branches of Agriculture in the District.
- 2 To encourage efficiency in all kinds of Agricultural work by Competitions, Exhibitions or Instruction Classes.
- 3 To promote improvements in the Breeding of Livestock.

- CONSTITUTION -

- 1 The Society shall be called the 'Fillongley Agricultural Society'.
- 2 The Management of the Society shall be vested in a President, Deputy President, Chairman, Vice Chairman, Deputy Vice Chairman, Hon. Secretary, Hon. Treasurer and Committee consisting of 23 Members with power to add to, or reduce their number. The Committee shall have the power to fill vacancies in any office or Committee during the year and elect sub-committees with the power to co-opt if necessary.
- 3 An Annual General Meeting of the Society shall be held not later than the end of February in each year, to receive the report of the Committee, and Treasurer's Financial Statement, to elect the President, Officers and Committee, and for such other purposes as may be necessary.
- 4 That all members shall retire each year, and shall be eligible for re-election.
- 5 The Executive Committee consisting of eight members of the main Committee, together with the President and the Chairman of the Society as ex-officio members.
- 6 The Annual Subscription shall be a minimum of £15 for all Members. The minimum subscription of a Vice President shall be £20.
- 7 All subscriptions shall be due and payable on the first day of January in each year, and every Member will be deemed liable for his subscription unless he gives two months' notice in writing to the Secretary (previous to 31st December) of his intention to withdraw.
- 8) No member whose subscription is unpaid shall be allowed to vote at any meeting.
- 9 Any protest or objection must be made:
 - (a) By Exhibitors on the Show Day in writing to the Secretary, with a deposit of £5 which will be forfeited if protest or objection not be allowed
 - (b) By Stewards within 14 days after the Show, should any irregularity come to their knowledge.

- 10 The Committee shall hear and determine all disputes that may arise and their decision shall be final.
- 11 If the voting at a Committee or General meeting shall be equal on each side, the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.
- 12 A record shall be kept of the attendances of each Committee member at the Committee meetings and the Secretary shall, if required, announce the result at the Annual Meeting, previous to the election of members for the ensuing year. Members not attending half the meetings duly summoned shall be liable to be taken off the Committee.
- 13 The Farms, Crop and Herds Competitions arranged by the Society shall be open to members or their employees, but the entry must be situated within 10 miles of Fillongley Church.
- 14 That on receipt of a requisition signed by not less than 10 Members, the Secretary shall call a Special General meeting not less than 14 days after receiving such requisition which shall specify the matter for which the Meeting is called, and no further business shall be transacted there at.
- 15 That the Accounts of the Society shall be audited by an Auditor (not a member of the Committee), who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting.
- 16 Alterations, amendments or additions to Rules, shall only be made at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special General Meeting called for that purpose. Notice of intention to proposed alterations, amendments or additions to the Rules shall be sent to the Secretary not less than fourteen days prior to the meeting.
- 17) At the Committee Meetings, members of the Society and other persons who may be officially invited may be present during the pleasure of the Chairman and may speak by his permission, but shall not have powers to vote or move resolutions.

-CONDITIONS-

- 1 NO EXHIBITOR SHALL MAKE MORE THAN ONE ENTRY IN EACH CLASS- (except Flower arranging)
- 2 All Exhibitors must certify that their Exhibits are of their own growing and have been in their possession for at least six weeks before Show Day.
- 3 Prizes won by any Exhibitor making an untrue certificate shall be forfeited and such Exhibitor shall also be prohibited from exhibiting at the Society's Shows in the future - This Rule will be strictly enforced.
- 4 The Judge's decision shall be final subject to General Rule 9 (with 25p deposit) and 20p regarding Protests or Objections.
- 5) All Exhibits with Exhibit No. attached must be placed in position in the Horticultural Tent from 7.00am until 9.00am and must NOT be removed before 5.00pm on Show Day. Tent to be cleared by 9.30am for judging to commence - This Rule will be strictly enforced. All entries to be cleared between 5pm and 6pm, anything remaining after this time will be removed and donated to charity.
- 6 The Committee have the right of inspecting the Garden of any Exhibitor at any time after receipt of entries.
- 7 The Committee will not be responsible for any loss, damage or mistakes arising from any cause whatsoever.
- 8 Class and Number Cards issued by the Society on Show Day to be placed on Exhibit prior to judging.
- 9 All Flower Arrangements must be in water or water retaining material.
- 10) Times stated can be changed at the discretion of the society.
- 11) The Society does not accept any liability for items overnight in the Horticultural tent.

355 Chocolate Cake made to the following recipe

Oven temperature: Gas mark 5/375°F or 180°C

5 oz/150g self-raising flour, 3oz/85g drinking chocolate powder, 6oz/175g margarine, 3 beaten eggs, 5oz/150g caster sugar, few drops vanilla essence, milk to moisten. Chocolate butter-cream filling. 7"/18cm tin.

Cream margarine and sugar and add vanilla essence. Stir in eggs, sift in flour and chocolate powder, adding milk to achieve dropping consistency. Place in greased lined tin and bake for 50—60 mins .

When cool split and fill with chocolate butter filling and dust top with sifted drinking chocolate powder.

Note: Will taste better three days after baking.

357 Victoria Sandwich—made with 3 eggs—Jam filled only.

358 Dundee Cake made to the following recipe

Oven temperature: Gas mark 3, 325°F or 170°C

5oz/150g butter, 5oz/150g caster sugar, 3 large eggs, 8oz/225g Sifted plain flour, Level teaspoon baking powder, milk (if needed), 6oz/175g currants, 6oz/175g sultanas, 2oz/50g glace cherries, rinsed, dried and cut in half, 2oz/50g finely chopped peel, 2 level tablespoons ground almonds, grated zest of an orange and a lemon, 2oz/50g whole blanched almonds.

Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy, beat eggs and add a little at a time to creamed mixture.

Fold in flour and baking powder. If a little dry at this point add a dessertspoon of milk. Fold in currants, sultanas, cherries, mixed peel , ground almonds and orange and lemon zest. Spoon mixture into 7 - 8 inch/18 - 20cm round tin. Arrange whole almonds on top and bake in centre of the oven for 2 - 2½hours until centre is firm and springy to the touch

Ingredients—225g Unsalted butter (softened) 225g Caster Sugar, 4 Eggs, Finely grated zest of 1 lemon, 225g self raising flour.

For the drizzle topping—Juice 1 1/2 lemons, 85g Caster sugar.

Heat the oven to 180c fan 160c gas mark 4.

Beat butter and sugar until pale and creamy, add eggs one at a time, slowly mix through. Sift in flour and lemon zest. Mix till well combined.

Line a 8 x 21cm tin with grease proof paper, spoon in the mixture and level off. Cook for 45—50 mins until a thin skewer inserted in the centre comes out clean. Whilst cake is cooling in tin, mix lemon juice and sugar to make the drizzle. Prick the warm cake all over with a skewer or fork, then pour over the drizzle mixture. Leave in tin until completely cool.

367 A Date and Walnut cake— made to the following recipe

Ingredients.— 8oz(226g) chopped dates, 1/2 cup chopped walnuts, a few cherries, 4oz(113g)butter, 8fl oz (250ml) water and orange juice combined. Grated rind of an orange, Good pinch of ginger, 1tspn baking powder, 2 small eggs, 8oz (226g) plain flour, 4oz(113g)caster sugar.

Heat dates, walnuts, cherries, butter, orange rind and the water / orange juice gently in a pan.

Beat eggs and sugar well.

Add date mixture to eggs and sugar mix.

Sift in dry ingredients.

Bake in 2 x 2lb loaf tins at 180c 350f or gas mark 4 for approx 1 hour.
