## **FILLONGLEY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY** **OBJECTIVES AND CONSTITUTION**

The Society's Objectives are:

1. To watch over, protect and further the interests of all branches of agriculture in the district.
2. To encourage the efficiency in all kinds of agricultural work by organising competitions, exhibitions and instruction classes.
3. Promote improvements in the breeding of livestock.

The Constitution Rules are:

- 1 The Society shall be called the 'Fillongley Agricultural Society'
2. The management of the Society shall be vested in a President, Deputy President, Chairman, Vice Chairman, Deputy Vice Chairman, Chairman, Hon. Secretary, Honorary Treasurer and Committee consisting of 23 members with the power to add or reduce their number. The Committee shall have the power to fill vacancies in any office or Committee during the year and elect sub-committees with the power to co-opt if necessary.
3. An Annual General Meeting of the Society shall not be held later than the end of February in each year, to receive the report of the Committee and Treasurer's Financial Statement, to elect the President, officers and Committee and for such other purposes as may be necessary.
- 4 That all members shall retire each year and shall be eligible for re-election.
5. The Executive Committee consisting of eight members of the main Committee, together with the President, Treasurer and the Chairman of the Society as ex-officio members. They will meet on an ad hoc basis and any decisions that need to be made as a result of a meeting are to be taken back to the General Committee for ratification.
6. The description 'Member' shall cover two types of membership, namely Friend of the Society and Vice President of the Society.
7. The Annual Subscription shall be a minimum of £20 for Friend of the Society and £25 for Vice President.
8. All subscriptions shall be due and payable on the first day of January in each year and every Vice President and Friend of the Society will be deemed liable for his subscription unless he gives two months' notice in writing to the Secretary (previous to 31 December) of his intention to withdraw.
9. No member whose subscription is unpaid shall be allowed to vote at any meeting.
10. Any protest or objections must be made:
  - (a) By exhibitors on the Show Day in writing to the Secretary with a deposit of £5 which will be forfeited if the protest or objection not be allowed.
  - (b) Stewards within 14 days after the Show should any irregularity come to their knowledge.
11. The Committee shall hear and determine all disputes that may arise and their decision shall be final.
12. If the voting at a committee or general meeting shall be equal on each side the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.
13. A record shall be kept of the attendances of each Committee member at the Committee meetings and the Secretary shall, if required, announce the result at the Annual Meeting previous to the election of members for the ensuing year. Members not attending half the meetings duly summoned shall be liable to be taken off the Committee.
- 14 The Farms, Crops and Herds Competitions arranged by the Society shall be open to all paid up members or their employees but the entry must be situated within 10 miles of Fillongley Church.
15. That on receipt of a requisition signed by not less than 10 members, the Secretary shall call a Special General meeting not less than 14 days after receiving the requisition which shall specify the matter for which the meeting is called and no further business shall be transacted at that time.
16. That the accounts of the Society shall be annually reviewed by an Independent Accountant who shall be elected at the A.G.M.
17. Alterations, amendments or additions to the Rules shall only be made at the Annual General Meeting or at a Special General Meeting called for that purpose. Notice of intention to proposed alterations, amendments or additions to the Rules shall be sent to the Secretary not less than 14 days prior to the meeting.
18. At the Committee meetings, members of the Society and other persons who may be officially invited may be present during the pleasure of the Chairman and may speak by his permission but shall not have powers to vote or move resolutions.

**Unsociable behaviour and inappropriate language is not acceptable and will not be permitted on the show ground and we have the right to ask you to leave at any time.**

## HORTICULTURE- HELPFUL HINTS FOR FIRST-TIME SHOW EXHIBITORS

1. Start by reading through the show schedule carefully. Bear in mind that the judges will use the schedule as their guide when they are judging and you will want your exhibit to comply with the rules.
2. A comment heard at many shows is this, "Oh, I have better than that at home!" Remember if it's still at home it can't be judged and so you can't win a prize for it. Enter as many classes as you can and you may be pleasantly surprised. One year there were no entries for parsnips, so anyone with three parsnips could have won a prize even if they weren't wonderful!
3. Take account of the date of the show and decide what exhibits you could realistically have ready to show on that date.
4. Where a class states a number, for example 'one dish of 12 plums' make sure that you have 12 plums and only 12 plums in your dish. A regular but simple mistake is to take 13 plums in case one gets damaged, and then to put them all in the dish! If the judge finds 13 (or 11) plums in your dish they can't be judged even though they might be the best quality plums entered.
5. The same advice applies to any weights or sizes given in the schedule. This applies particularly to pot sizes and display sizes. Pots are measured for the diameter at the rim (straight across the top)
6. Where a class asks for two or more vegetables, fruits or flowers (e.g. two cabbages), try to select matching one (e.g. am matching pair of cabbages). If you have one large one and several others smaller to make a group (e.g. six tomatoes) leave the large one out in favour of matching the size of the smaller ones so your display looks uniform as possible. A judge will often compare the smallest with the biggest in your exhibit to see how evenly matched they are.
7. Pods of peas are judged by opening one pod to examine the contents. You can't do this with your exhibit as they must all be closed for judging. Opening other pods at home may not give you a clue about the ones on the show bench. A helpful hint is to hold the pods up to the light. A strong enough light will usually show you the peas lying in the pod as darker shadows inside the green pod. It's almost like x-raying them! Do not use any pods that have spaces in them. It's trickier to guess the contents of the broad bean pods, but you can often feel the beans as bumps in the soft woolly pod lining.
8. Cabbages, lettuces and cauliflowers are exhibited in this schedule with their roots intact. They should be washed clean of soil or compost and any longer roots can be trimmed a little to make them neat. All leaves should be left on the exhibit. This is to ensure that exhibits have been grown by the exhibitor and not bought from a shop, as shop vegetables will have their roots and outer leaves cut off.
9. When showing potatoes wash the soil or compost off carefully without breaking, scratching or bruising the skin. It's best to do this gently by hand and not to scrub them.
10. A good way to show shallots is to arrange them on some fine sand on a plate. This helps them to stand up straight and shows them off to their best advantage.
11. Onions can be sat on top of rings cut from cardboard or plastic tube for the same reason.
12. Label each exhibit with the name of the variety you have grown if you can. A small, neat slip of card or paper on the plate or by the exhibit makes viewing the show more interesting to the public and it is helpful for the judges. It is useful to check the spelling of names from your seed packet or catalogue.
13. Where the schedule says a plate or dish, this can be a paper plate. The size should be suitable for the space your vegetables will take up, so they are not cramped on the plate but nicely arranged.
14. Plants growing in pots will display better if you clean the outside of the pot carefully before showing them. This is particularly important with clay pots as they can get green and slimy. The judges may pick up the pot to inspect your plant and they won't thank you for getting their hands dirty! Some exhibitors will put their plants into new or clean pots just before bringing them to the show.
15. Jams and Preserves. No commercial jars or lids should be used. Jams and marmalade should be in, if possible, 1lb/454g jars filled to within 1/8<sup>th</sup>/3mm of an inch of the rim and a new lid should be used at all times. All jars should be named and dated and if frozen fruit used it should also indicate this. Use only clean, non-sticky jars. Curd should be sealed with a waxed disc when potted and a cellophane cover when completely cold. It should not have a twist lid. Chutneys and pickles must have a metal, plastic lined lid and should be filled to within 1/2 inch/12.5mm of the rim. The chutney must be at least three months old to allow the flavours to mature. Following these simple guidelines also ensure the Health and Safety of entrants and Judges.

Finally, do have fun while planning your exhibits and bringing them to the show. Not everyone can win a prize, but we can all enjoy the day! It can be a bit daunting the first time, but you may find that showing soon becomes addictive.

## **HORTICULTURAL SECTION**

### **Conditions of Entry**

1. No exhibitor shall make more than one entry in each class.
2. All exhibitors must certify if requested that their exhibits are of their own growing and have been in their possession for at least six weeks before show day.
3. Prizes won by any exhibitor making an untrue certificate shall be forfeited and such exhibitor shall be prohibited from exhibiting at future Society shows.
4. Any protest or objection must be made:
  - a) By exhibitors on the show day in writing to the Secretary with a deposit of £5. If the protest or objection is not allowed the deposit will be forfeited.
  - b) By Stewards within 14 days after the show should any irregularity come to their knowledge.
5. The Judge's decision shall be final subject to Condition 4 above.
6. All exhibits must be placed in position in the Horticultural Tent between 4pm and 6.30 pm on the Saturday preceding the show or between 7am and 8.45am on show day and can only be removed between 4.45 pm and 6 pm on show day. The Horticultural Tent is to be cleared by 9am on show day for judging to commence at 9.15am prompt and will not be reopened until all judging and prize cards are complete. All entries to be cleared between 4.45pm and 6pm on show day. Any exhibits remaining after this time will be removed and donated to charity.
7. The Committee have the right of inspecting the garden or allotment of any exhibitor at any time after the receipt of entries.
8. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss, damage or mistakes arising from any cause whatsoever.
9. Class and number cards issued against entries made must be placed on exhibits prior to judging.
10. All flower arrangements must be in water or water retaining material.
11. Times stated can be changed at the discretion of the Society.
12. The Society does not accept liability for items in the Horticultural tent.

### **DATA PROTECTION**

The data provided by you to the Fillongley Agricultural Society will be stored securely with access limited to designated officers of the Society. You have the right to see, amend or have destroyed your data upon request.

All details are used specifically for the administration of the class entries (some of which are required by law) and will not be transferred to any other party without the written consent of the individual concerned, in accordance with GDPR guidelines.

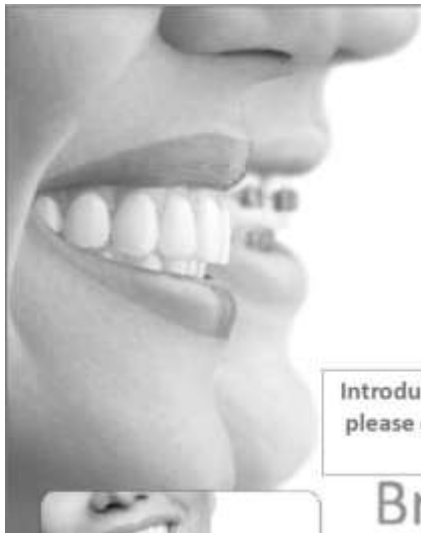

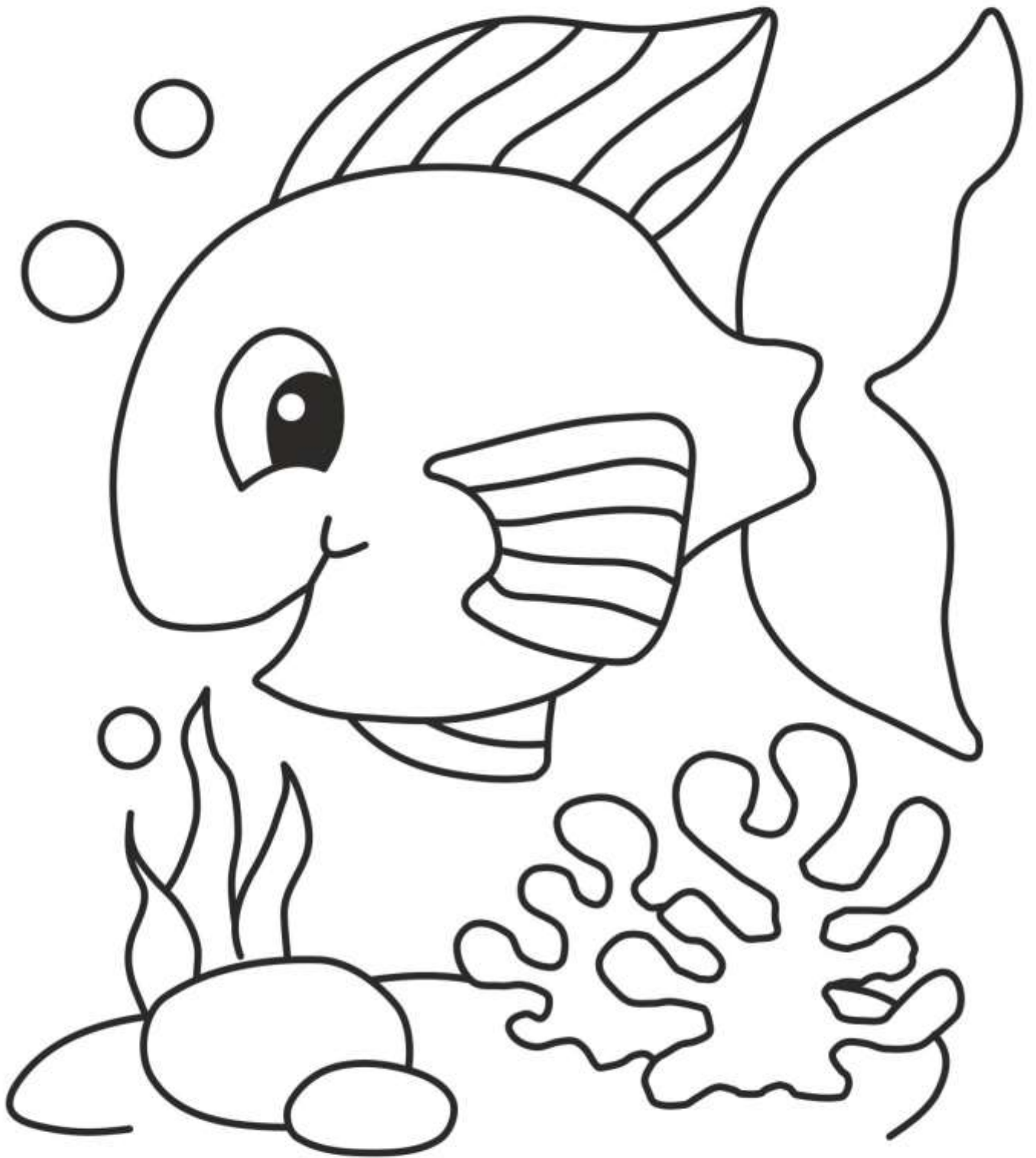
