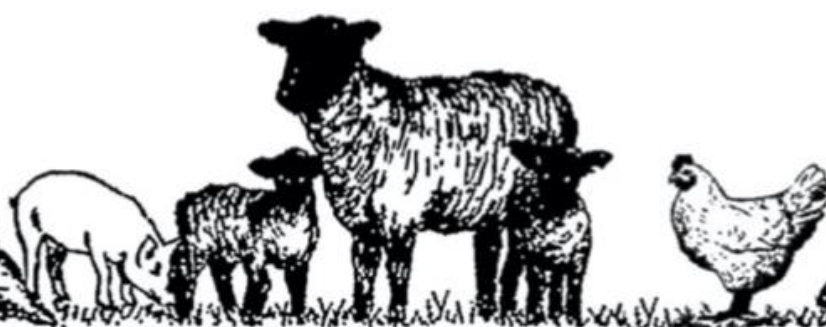

CRAFT AND PRODUCE SHOW

Conditions of Entry

1. No exhibitor shall make more than one entry in each class.
2. All exhibitors must certify if requested that their exhibits are of their own growing and have been in their possession for at least six weeks before show day.
3. Prizes won by any exhibitor making an untrue certificate shall be forfeited and such exhibitor shall be prohibited from exhibiting at future Society shows.
4. Any protest or objection must be made:
 - a) By exhibitors on the show day in writing to the Secretary with a deposit of £5. If the protest or objection is not allowed the deposit will be forfeited.
 - b) By stewards within 14 days after the show should any irregularity come to their knowledge.
5. The judge's decision shall be final subject to Condition 4 above.
6. All exhibits must be entered and staged in the Village Hall between 8.00am and 9.15am on show day and can only be removed from 4.00pm onwards. The area must be cleared by 9.25am for judging to commence at 9.30am prompt and will be reopened to the public from 12.00pm onwards. Any exhibits remaining after 5.00pm will be removed and donated to charity.
7. The Society accepts no responsibility for loss or injury caused to owner, exhibitor, steward or member of the public or their property save for such damage having been due to the negligence of the Society or their appointed agents.
8. Class and number cards issued against entries made must be placed on exhibits prior to judging.
9. All flower arrangements must be in water or water retaining material.
10. Times stated can be changed at the discretion of the Society.
11. The Society does not accept liability for items in the Village Hall.
